10. Program: Eva Roshong spoke with passion and humor about Rotary Club founder Paul Harris. The highlights of The Exciting Life of Paul Harris are as follows:

- ◆ Paul Harris was born in Racine, Wisconsin in 1868 but moved to Vermont at an early age to live with his grandparents. He was acclaimed to be fun, friendly, and caring. He received his law degree at the University of Iowa and worked as a teacher, a reporter, an actor, a cowboy, and traveled extensively selling marble and granite.
- ◆ On 23 February, 1905, Paul Harris formed the first club with three other businessmen and he named the new club "Rotary" because members met in rotation at their various places of business. Club membership grew rapidly. Soon Paul became convinced that the Rotary club could be developed into an important service movement and strove to extend Rotary to other cities. President emeritus Paul Harris passed away on 27 January, 1947.
- ◆ By 1912 there were 50 clubs and the first convention was held in Duluth, Minnesota. The Louisville Rotary Club was started in 1925, a mere 20 years after the first club!
- ◆ The stated purpose of the organization is to bring together business and professional leaders to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. There are 33,976 clubs and over 1.22 million members worldwide.

◆ In addition to the ◆good works◆ and community projects, International Rotary provides members an opportunity for ◆fun & fellowship.◆

◆ Song Master Eva Roshong led us in a spirited rendition of our very own ◆Ro, Ro, Rotary, It◆s for you and me!◆
